of Benjamin, saying: Go and lie in wait in the vineyards; 21 and regard, and, behold, if the daughters of Shiloh come forth to dance with dances, then come ye out of the vineyards, and seize for yourselves each one his wife of the daughters of Shiloh, and get you to the land of Benjamin. 22 And it shall be, when their fathers or their brethren come to us to complain, that we will say unto them: Be favourable unto them for our sakes, because we reserved not to each man his wife in the war: if ye give them not unto them at this time, ye will be guilty.

<sup>23</sup> And the children of Benjamin did so, and carried off wives, according to their number, of those who danced, whom they caught: then they went and returned unto their inheritance, and built "the cities and dwelt in them.

<sup>24</sup> And the children of Israel departed from thence at that time, each one to his own tribe and to his family, and they went out from thence each man to

his own inheritance.

<sup>25</sup> In those days there was no king in Israel: each one did that which was right in his own eyes.

### THE

CHAPTER I.

ND it came to pass in the days A when the judges ruled Israel, that there was a famine in the land. And a certain man of Beth-lehem-judah departed to sojourn in the country of Moab, he, and his wife, and his two sons. <sup>2</sup> And the name of the man was Elimelech, and the name of his wife Naomi, and the name of his two sons Mahlon and Chilion, Ephrathites of Beth-lehem-judah. And they came into the country of Moab, and lived there.

<sup>3</sup> Now Elimelech Naomi's husband died; and she was left, with her two sons. 4 And they took themselves wives from Moab; the name of the one was Orpah, and the name of the other, Ruth: and they abode there about ten years.

<sup>5</sup> And both of them, Mahlon and Chilion died: and the woman was bereaved of her two sons as well as her husband.

6 Then she arose with her daughtersin-law, that she might return from the country of Moab: for she had heard in the country of Moab how JEHOVAH had visited "His people in giving them bread. 7 Therefore she went forth out of the place where she was, and her two daughters-in-law with her; and they went on their journey to return into the land of Judah. 8 And Naomi said unto her two daughters-in-law: Depart ye, return each one to her mother's house: may JEHOVAH deal graciously with you, according as ye have dealt with the dead, and with me. 9 May JEHOVAH grant unto you that ye may find rest each one in the house of her husband. Then she kissed them; and they lifted up their voice, and wept.

<sup>10</sup> And they said unto her: Surely we will return with thee unto thy people.

11 But Naomi answered: Turn back, my daughters: wherefore would ye go with me? yet are there sons in my womb, that they might be your husbands? 12 Return, my daughters, depart; for I am too old to have a husband. For should I say, I have hope, should I have a husband to-night, and might also bear sons; 13 would ye wait for them until they were grown up? would ye wait from having husbands? nay, my daughters; for I have much bitterness for your sakes, that the hand of JEHO-VAH is gone out against me. 14 Then they lifted up their voice, and wept again: and Orpah kissed her mother-inlaw [a and returned to her own people]; but Ruth clave unto her.

15 Then she said: Behold, thy sisterin-law has gone back unto her people, and unto her gods: return thou after

thy sister-in-law.

16 And Ruth said: Entreat me not to leave thee, or to turn back from following thee; for whither thou goest, I will go; and where thou lodgest, I will lodge: thy people are my people, and thy God my God: 17 where thou diest I will die, and there will I be buried: JEHOVAH do so to me, and more also, if even death separate between thee and me.

18 When she saw that she was determined in herself to go with her, then she desisted from entreating her. 19 So they two went until they came to Bethlehem. And so it was, when they came to Beth-lehem, that all the city was in excitement respecting them, and they

said: Is this Naomi?

20 But she replied unto them: Call me not Naomi, call me Mara: for the AL-MIGHTY hath dealt very bitterly with me. 21 I went out full, and JEHOVAH hath returned me empty: wherefore call ye me Naomi, now that JEHOVAH hath testified against me, and the ALMIGHTY hath afflicted me?

<sup>22</sup> So Naomi returned, and Ruth the Moabitess, her daughter-in-law, with her, who returned out of the country of Moab: and they came to Beth-lehem at the beginning of barley harvest.

### CHAPTER II.

Now Naomi had a kinsman by her husband, an exalted man of wealth, of the family of Elimelech: and his name was Boaz.

<sup>2</sup> And Ruth the Moabitess said unto Naomi: Let me now go to the field, and glean ears of corn after him in whose eyes I shall find favour. And she said

unto her: Go, my daughter.

3 So she went, and came, and gleaned in the field after the reapers: and her a hap happened on the part of the field belonging to Boaz, who was of the family of Elimelech.

<sup>4</sup> And, lo, Boaz came from Beth-lehem, and said unto the reapers: JEHOVAH be with you: and they replied to him:

JEHOVAH bless thee.

<sup>5</sup> Then Boaz said unto his servant who was set over the reapers: Whose damsel is this? 6 And the servant who was appointed over the reapers, answered and said: It is the Moabitish damsel who returned with Naomi out of the country of Moab. 7 For she said: Let me, I pray you, glean and gather up after the reapers among the sheaves : so she came, and has continued from morning even until now, except that she tarried a little while in the house.

8 Then said Boaz unto Ruth: b Understandest thou not, my daughter? Go not forth to glean in any other field, neither pass over from hence, but keep close with my maidens: 9 thine eyes be on the field which they reap, and walk thou behind them: have I not commanded the young men to let thee alone? and when thou art athirst, go unto the vessels, and drink from that which the young men have drawn. 10 Then she fell upon her face, and bowed herself to the ground, and said unto him: Wherefore have I found favour in thine eyes, that thou shouldest take notice of me, for I am a stranger?

11 Then Boaz answered and said unto her: It has been fully declared unto me, all that thou hast done unto "thy mother-in-law since the death of thine husband: and that thou hast left thy father and thy mother, and the land of thy nativity, and art come unto a people whom thou knewest not heretofore. 12 Jehovah recompense thy work, and an abundant reward be given thee from JEHOVAH the God of Israel, under whose wings thou art come to trust.

13 Then she said: Let me find favour in thine eyes, my lord; because thou hast comforted me, and because thou hast spoken to the heart of thine handmaid. a O that I might be like one of

thine own handmaidens!

14 And Boaz said unto her: At mealtime draw near hither, and eat of the bread, and dip thy morsel into the vinegar. And she sat beside the reapers: and he reached her parched corn, and she did eat, and was sufficed, and went 15 And when she rose up to glean, Boaz commanded his young men, saying: Let her glean even between the sheaves, and reproach her not: 16 but even let fall some of the handfuls for her, and leave them there, that she may glean them, and rebuke her not. <sup>17</sup> So she gleaned in the field until the evening, and beat out "that which she had gleaned: and it was about an ephah of barley. 18 And she took it up, and went into the city: and b she showed unto "her mother-in-law "what she had gleaned: cthen she brought forth, and gave unto her of that she had reserved after she was herself satisfied.

<sup>19</sup> And her mother-in-law said to her: Where hast thou gleaned this day? and where hast thou laboured? Blessed be he who took notice of thee. Then she told her mother-in-law with "whom she had laboured, and said: The name of the man with whom I laboured this day is

Boaz.

<sup>20</sup> And Naomi replied unto her daughter-in-law: Blessed be he of Jeho-VAH, who hath not d abated His kindness to "the living or to "the dead. And Naomi said unto her: The man is near of kin to us, he e who hath right to redeem. 21 And Ruth the Moabitess said: He said unto me also, Thou shalt keep close to my servants until they have finished 'all my harvest. 22 Then Noami said unto Ruth her daughter-in-law: It

23 So she kept close by the maidens of Boaz to glean until the end of barley harvest and of wheat harvest; and abode with her mother-in-law.

#### CHAPTER III.

THEN Naomi her mother-in-law said L unto her: My daughter, ought I not to seek rest for thee, that it may be well with thee? <sup>2</sup> And now is not Boaz of our kindred, with whose maidens thou wast? Behold, he winnoweth barley this night in the a threshing-floor. 3 Therefore wash thyself, and anoint thee, and put thy raiment upon thee, and go down to the threshing-floor: do not make thyself known to the man until he shall have finished eating and drinking. And it shall be, when he reclineth, that thou shalt take notice of "the place where he reclineth, and thou shalt go in, and lift up the clothes over his feet and lay down; and he will tell thee what thou shalt do.

<sup>5</sup> And she answered her: All that thou tellest me that will I do. 6 And she went down unto the floor, and did according to all which her mother in-law commanded her; 7 for when Boaz had eaten and drunk, and his heart was refreshed, and he went to recline at the end of the heap of corn, that she came softly, and lifted up the clothes from his

feet, and laid her down.

8 And so it was, at midnight, that the man was restless, and turned about; and, lo, a woman lay at his feet. 9 Then he said: Who art thou? And she answered: I am Ruth thine handmaid: b spread therefore thy skirt over thine handmaid, because thou art my kinsman. 10 And he answered: Blessed be thou of Jehovah, my daughter: better is thy latter kindness than the preceding, in that thou goest not after young men, whether poor or rich. 11 And now, my daughter, fear not; all that thou requireth of me I will perform unto thee: surely all of the gate of my people know that thou art a virtuous woman. 12 And now it is true that I am a near kinsman: howbeit there is a kinsman nearer than I. 13 Lodge this night, and it shall be in the morning, if he will perform unto thee the part of a kinsman, well: let him do the kinsman's part; but if he is not willing to perform the part of a kinsman unto thee, then will I do the

18 Then she replied: Sit still, my daughter, until thou knoweth how this matter will be decided: for the man will not rest until he have completed the

matter this day.

#### CHAPTER IV.

THEN Boaz went up to the gate, and seated himself there: and, behold, the kinsman of whom Boaz spoke passed by; so he said: Ho, such a one! turn back; sit down here. So he turned back, and sat down. <sup>2</sup> Then he took ten men of the elders of the city, and said: Sit ye here: and they sat down.

<sup>3</sup> Then he spake unto the kinsman: Naomi, who is come back out of the country of Moab, selleth a portion of land, which was our brother Elimelech's: 4 so I said: I would reveal it to thine ear, saying, Buy it in the presence of the inhabitants, and in the presence of the elders of my people. If thou wilt redeem, redeem; but if thou wilt not redeem, declare unto me, that I may know: for there is no one to redeem except thyself, and c myself after thee. Then he said: I will redeem it. 5 But Boaz said: In the day thou buyest the field of the hand of Naomi, thou must also buy it of Ruth the Moabitess, the wife of the dead, to raise up the name of the dead upon his inheritance. 6 Then said the kinsman: I cannot redeem for myself, lest I destroy my own inheritance: redeem thou thyself imy right of redemption; for I cannot redeem it.

Now this was the custom in former time in Israel concerning redeeming and concerning exchange, to confirm all matters: a man drew off his sandal, and gave it to his neighbour; and this was

the testimony in Israel.

8 So the kinsman said to Boaz: Buy it for thyself. Therefore he drew off his 9 And Boaz spake unto the sandal.

part of a kinsman unto thee, as Jeho-VAH liveth : lie down until the morning. 14 So she lay at his feet until the morning: then she rose up before one could discern a another. And he said: Let it not be known that a woman came into the floor. 15 Also he said: Bring the veil which was upon thee, and hold it; and when she held it, then he measured six measures of barley, and placed it upon her; and she came into the city. 16 And when she came unto her mother-in-law, then she said: Who art thou? my daughter? Then she related to her all that the man had done unto her: 17 also she said: These six measures of barley gave he unto me; for he said b to me: Go

elders, and all the people: Ye are witnesses this day, that I have bought 'all which belonged to Elimelech, and 'all which belonged to Chilion and Mahlon, of the hand of Naomi. 10 Moreover "Ruth the Moabitess, the wife of Mahlon, have I purchased to myself for a wife, to raise up the name of the dead upon his inheritance, that the name of the dead be not cut off from among his brethren, and from the gate of his abode: ye are witnesses this day. 11 Then all the people who were in the gate, and the elders, said: Witnesses are we. JE-HOVAH grant to the woman who is come into thine house to be like Rachel and like Leah, who together built the house of Israel: and do thou prosperously in Ephratah, and may thy name be renowned in Bethlehem: 12 also may thy house be like the house of Pharez, whom Tamar bare unto Judah, of the offspring which JEHOVAH will give thee of this young woman.

13 Then Boaz took "Ruth, and she was

his wife: and when he went in unto her, JEHOVAH gave her conception, and she

bare a son.

14 And the women said unto Naomi: Blessed be Jehovah, who hath not caused to cease unto thee a kinsman this day, and may his name be renowned in Israel: 15 and may he be unto thee a restorer of thy life, and to nourish thy grey hairs: because thy daughter-inlaw, who loveth thee, who is better to thee than seven sons, hath born him.

16 And Naomi took "the child, and laid it in her bosom, and became nurse

to him.

<sup>17</sup> And the women her neighbours gave him a name, saying: There is a son born to Naomi! and they called his name Obed: he is the father of Jesse, the father of David.

18 Now these are the generations of Pharez:

Pharez begat "Hezron,

19 And Hezron begat "Ram, And Ram begat "Amminadab,

20 And Amminadab begat "Nahshon, And Nahshon begat "Salmon,

21 And Salmon begat Boaz, And Boaz begat "Obed,

CHAPTER I.

TOW there was a certain man of Ramathaim-zophim, of mount Ephraim, and his name was Elkanah, the son of Jeroham, the son of Elihu, the son of Tohu, the son of Zuph, an Ephrathite.

<sup>8</sup> Then Elkanaĥ her husband said unto her: Hannah, wherefore weepest thou? and why eatest thou not? and why is thy heart grieved? am not I better to thee than ten sons?
