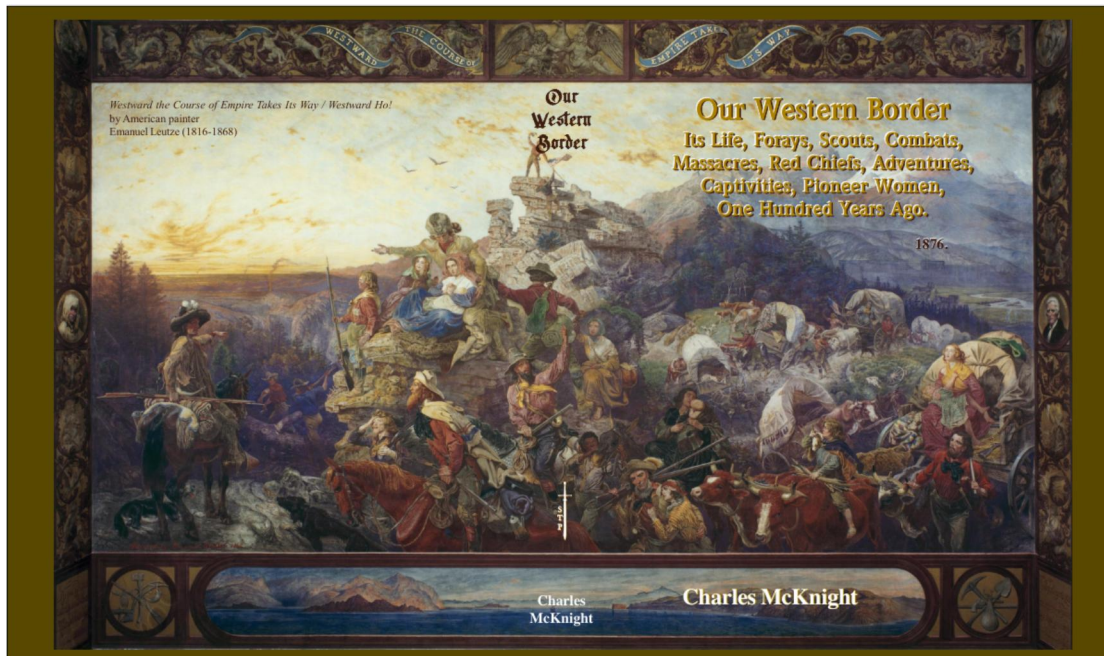

I expanded it to 136% for 8x11, paperback, full-color cover, 752pp., (not counting illustration pages) 60.00 + P&H.

Print On Demand Companies that have reprinted this book (sweat shops in India and China) print it 6x9 or smaller. I have enlarged the page size to 136% to 8x11 and it is at 13-point times new roman print size... very comfortable for reading. I can print in paperback or hardback (one or the other)... my paperback cover below (of the full cover, front, back, and spine). Printed like most of my paperbacks on 60# / 440ppi archival paper;

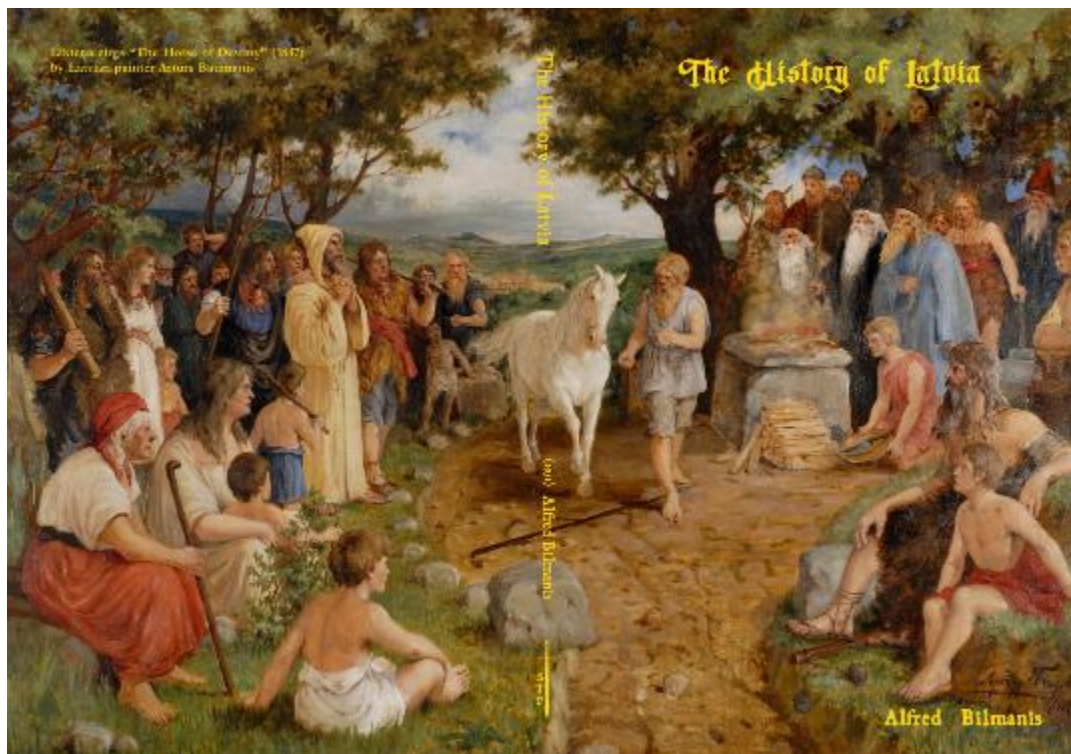

Cheaper editions of books I print may be found on the market, but most are sweat shop labor in India or China or elsewhere, by those who don't care about the product and probably can't even read it; who have plain or nonsensical unimaginative covers, and do not clean up the text, and often use inferior quality materials; and some are often OCR / retypeset that has not been proofread and contain gobbledygook, misspelled, indistinguishable words, etc. I clean up all marginalia / underlining / circling / shadows and restructure damaged / missing text, and often include extra information ("about the author", photo, etc.); my editions are the highest quality on the market, with archival quality (often 460pp. / 60# quality paper) and are 100% USA start to finish.

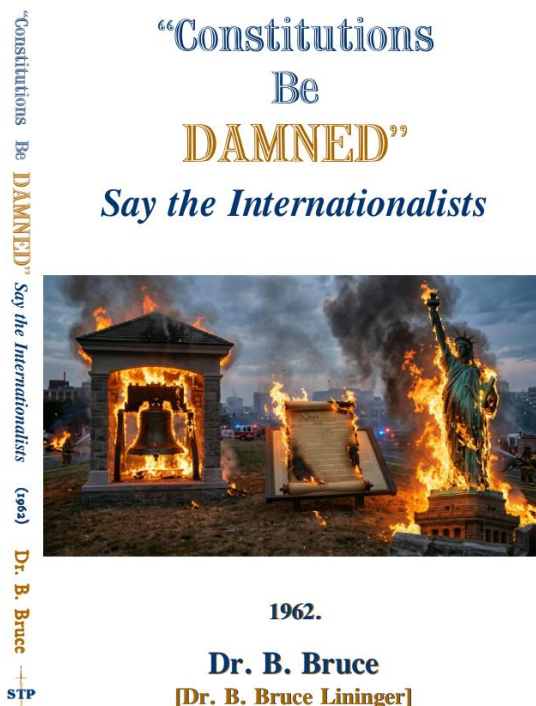

That museum is our language. There is no word in English, French, or German, which is not older than the oldest of the pyramids, and yet, while we are willing to pay any sum for a scarabee containing the name of Sesostris, which after all tells us very little, we attach hardly any value to words which, if we would only trace them back to their distant source, might teach us lessons of the highest import. It does not matter what language we take or what word we choose; every one of them will carry us back to times when there were as yet no statues, no gems, no coins, no cylinders, no pyramids, not even lacustrian dwellings, stone hammers, or flint-heads. For all these are the workmanship of intelligent beings, and no being can be intelligent without language.

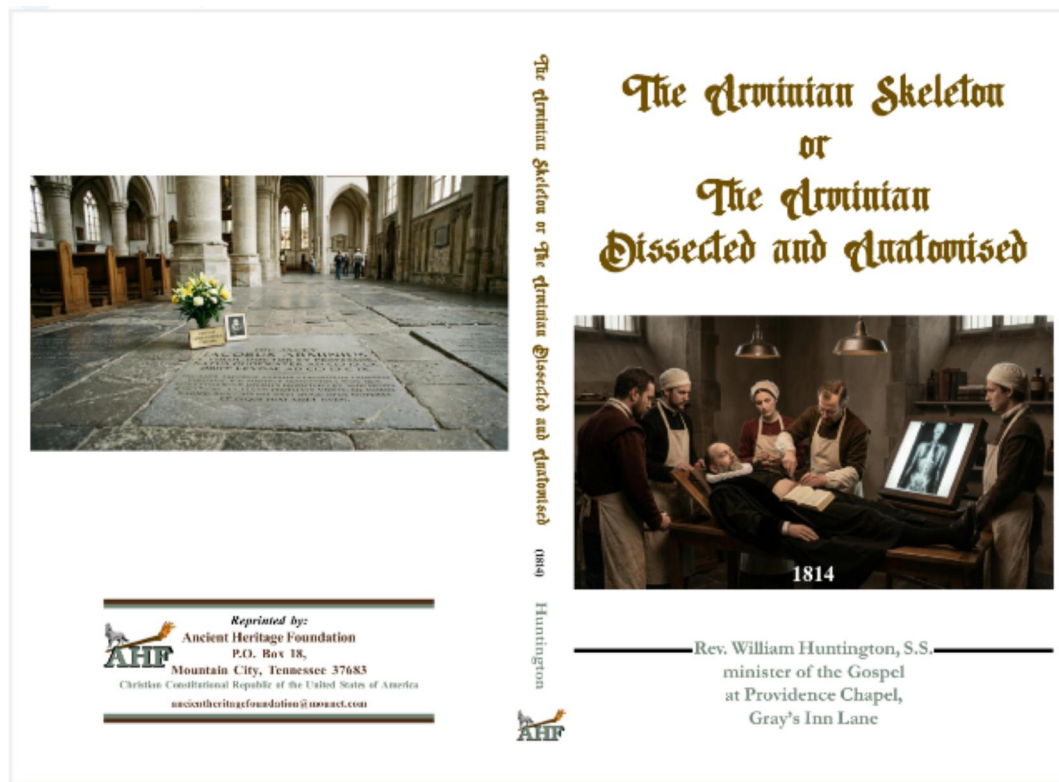

- **Martyrs' Mirror: Story of Seventeen Centuries of Christian Martyrdom from Time of Christ to persecutions of Anabaptists in a.d. 1660** (1660) van Braght, 9x12 embossed cloth **Hardback**, 1156pp., **75.00 + P&H**; main book Christian faith (2nd to Bible) among German groups (Mennonites, Amish, etc.); it is to Dutch & German peoples what Foxe's Book of Martyrs is to English speaking peoples. [my 7x-great grandfather Rev. Dielman Kolb, Jr., & 9x-great-grandfather Bishop Jacob Gottschalk spear-headed its being translated from Dutch into German in 1749 in Pennsylvania; printed from the 1938 English edition printed in Scottdale, Penna.]; with 28-page detailed historical / biographical / genealogical illustrated introduction researched and written by me (RAB). **INQUIRE if interested; this is done and ready to print if enough people are interested. I started this massive project 10 years ago and was 3/4 done until other things took priority; just slowly and carefully photocopying the 6-pound original (which cost me \$150) was costly, time-consuming, and a tedious chore. The introduction took me about 80 hours to research and write.** A less expensive edition is still available (of course, without my illustrated historical biographical introduction) by a different publisher, 8.5x11, Hb., which was printed in 2002, for 55.00 + P&H; which I have stocked for 3 decades (I initially stocked the printing before the 2002 printing, which was in the 1990s). [Gold in 2002 was \$310 / oz.; today it is \$4,000 / oz. If \$75 seems pricey, the \$55 of 2002 today would be \$709; and thus my edition is underpriced. You may be able to find print on demand from sweat shop companies in India or China, but their quality is poor, their edition won't have the care or extra info of my edition, and you

will be supporting the enemies of Christ and Christendom; and the same goes for all the other books that I print. My editions are the highest quality on the market.]

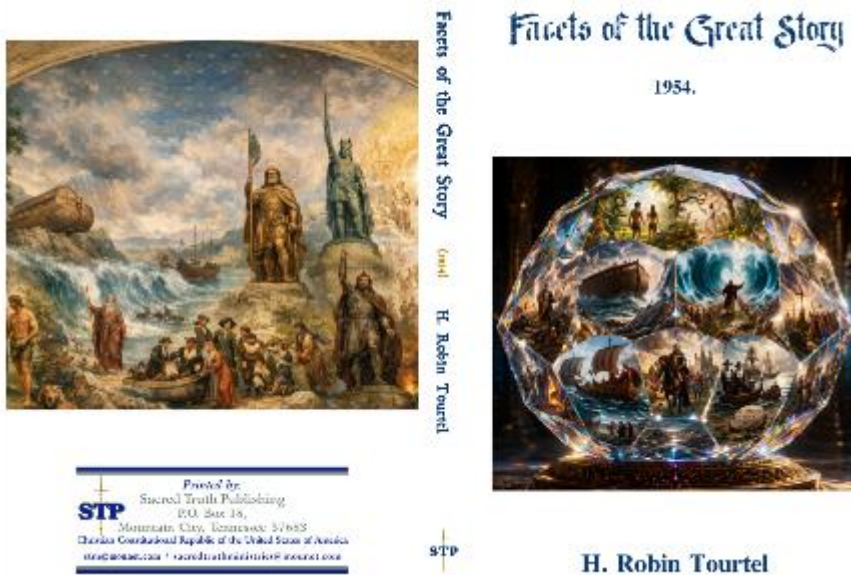

- **Latvia Under German Occupation 1941-1943** (1944) published by the Press Bureau of the Latvian Legation, with a Preface by the Minister of Latvia to the United States, Dr. Alfred Bilmanis, 114pp., plastic comb-bound 14.50 + P&H. I will print in paperback if there is enough interest.

- **The History of Ireland from the Earliest Period to the Present Time** (1867; 1885 ed.) Martin Haverty; 8.5x11, **Hardback** 1,162pp., illustrated, chapt on Celtic literature & geography of counties of Ireland (not in 1867 ed.). This is not "Annals of the Kingdom of Ireland, by the Four Masters" (7 vols./4,000pp. rare & very expensive). [Though I do have a few volumes in paperback by another publisher. **INQUIRE.** Haverty drew directly from The Annals..., gleaning most relevant & from modern editors of The Annals... (Dr. O'Donovan, Prof. Eugene Curry, Rev C.P. Meehan, Dr. R.R. Madden, & other eminent scholars). Haverty's considered finest work on Irish History; entire text intact; contains short history of "The Annals..." & brief biography of The Four Masters, editors & translators (& photos) Haverty, & others who wrote classic works on history of Ireland (Geoffrey Keating, Villanueva, etc.) written / compiled by Balaicius. **INQUIRE if interested - again, my copies of these rare reprints are far superior to the print on demand sweatshops in India or China... who don't know or care about the product, who don't restructure damaged or missing text, who don't clean up underlining / marginalia, and who often print them with a shadow on the whole page and sometimes in very small print (I've seen some that were 6 point print or smaller! — unreadable without a magnifying glass); leaving very large margins, not even thinking of the reader; sometimes they have pages missing, and very often they do not set the book up properly and all the page numbers are in the center margin, with the odd numbered pages on the right and even on the left, as they do not even know how a book is supposed to be read; and those companies churn out anti-christ, pro-pervert, subversive, and other books and ordering from those companies supports their wicked endeavor to print just anything to make money. Except for a few rare exceptions our generation will produce very few antiques as most everything is inferior in quality and disposable and not made to last. My books are the highest-quality on the market and archival material. My books are 100% USA start to finish. RAB/STM**
